

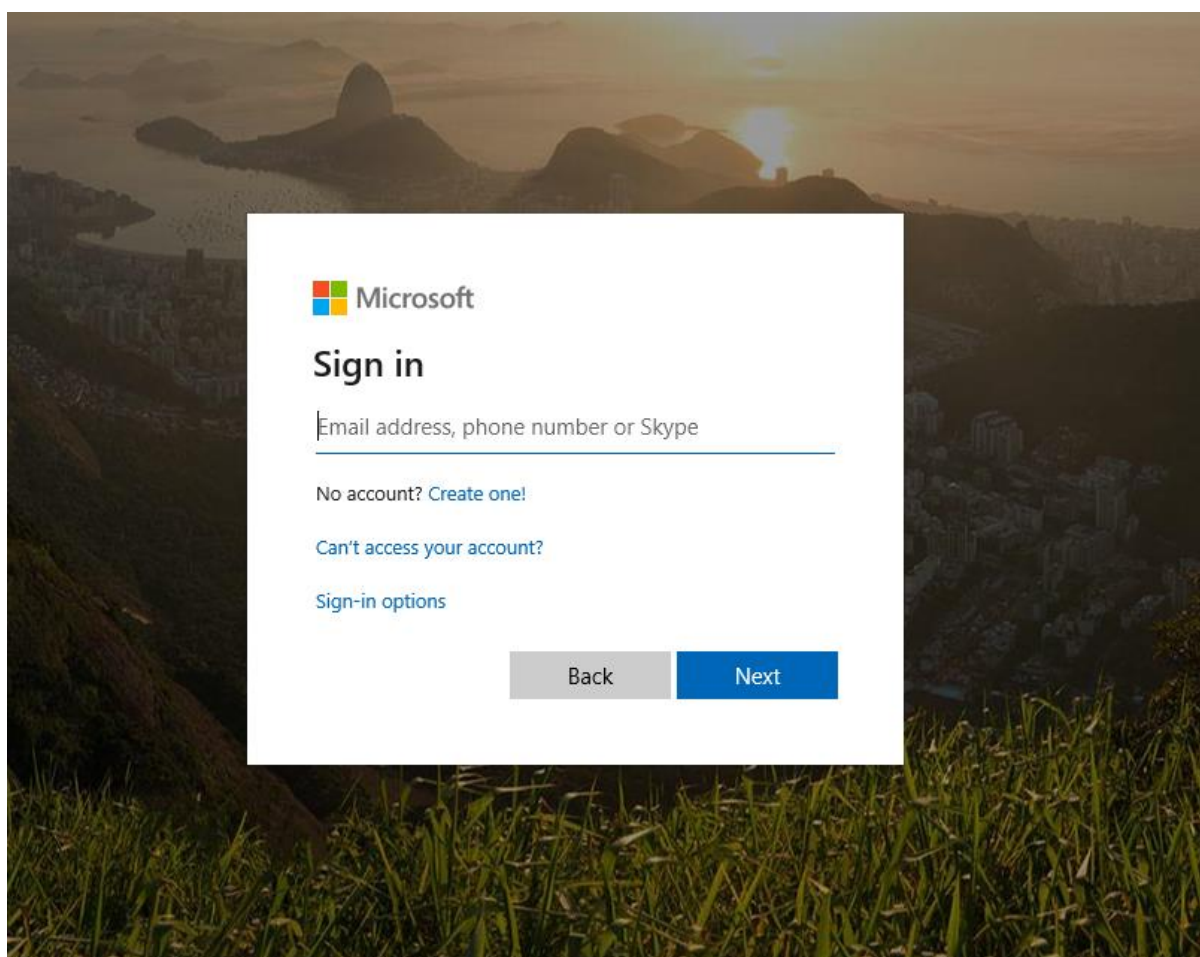
Remote Learning Guidance – Use of Teams

To ensure that you are able to continue studying during any closure we have arranged for your teachers to provide you work and resources through Microsoft Teams.

You have Microsoft Teams as part of your Office 365 login.

In order to access Teams you will need to visit www.office.com.

You will be asked for your email address:



Your email address is your username for the computers at school with @moseleypark.org at the end. For example, if your name is Tracy Smith and you are in year 11 your email address will be 15tsmith@moseleypark.org. When you click next you will be asked for your password. This is the same password as you use for the computers at school.

If there is a problem with your password please email: icthelp@moseleypark.org they will email you back your reset password. (You will need to do this from a different email address).

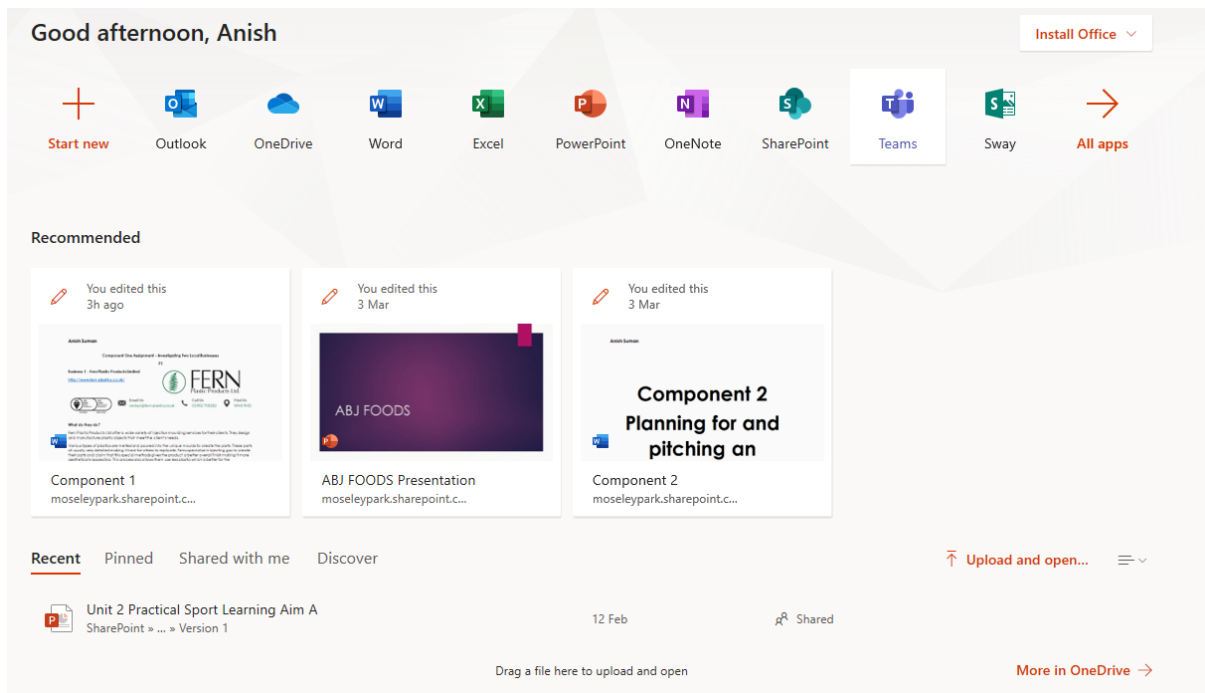
When you are successfully logged in you will be able to access Office 365 and the following applications:

Outlook – Access emails from school and teachers.

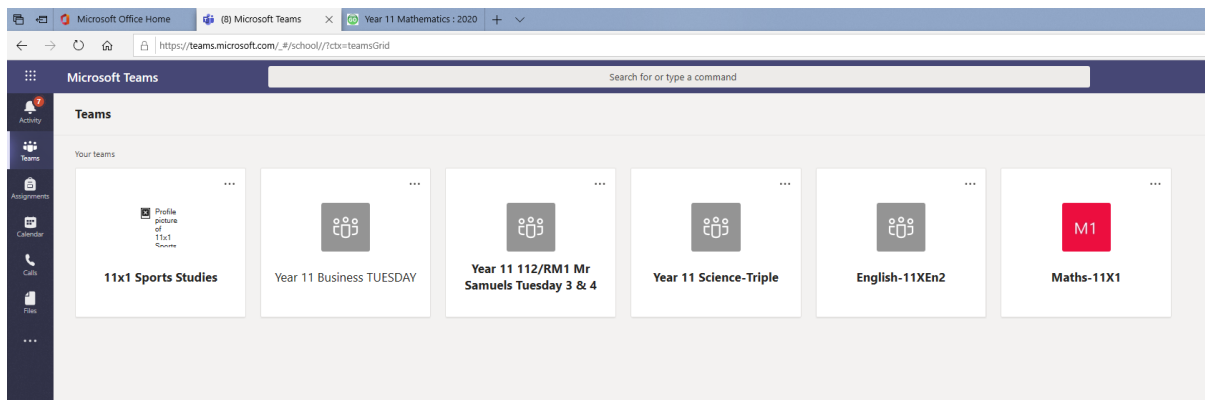
Onedrive – Store documents and files.

Excel/Powerpoint/Word – Online versions of the applications you use in school.

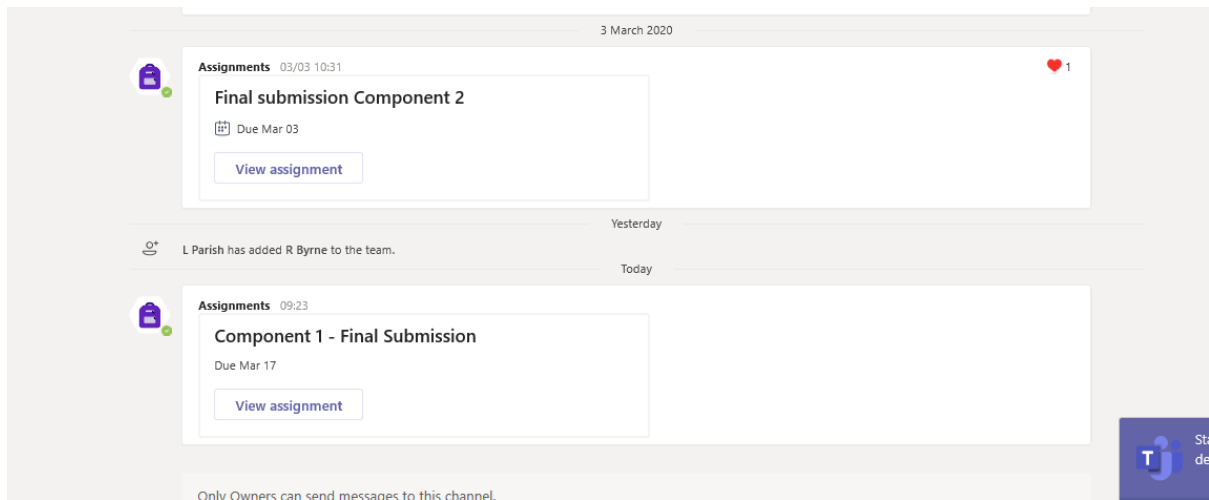
Teams – Where teachers will share resources and set assignments.



You will be given a screen that looks like this. You choose an option by clicking on it. To open Teams just click Teams.

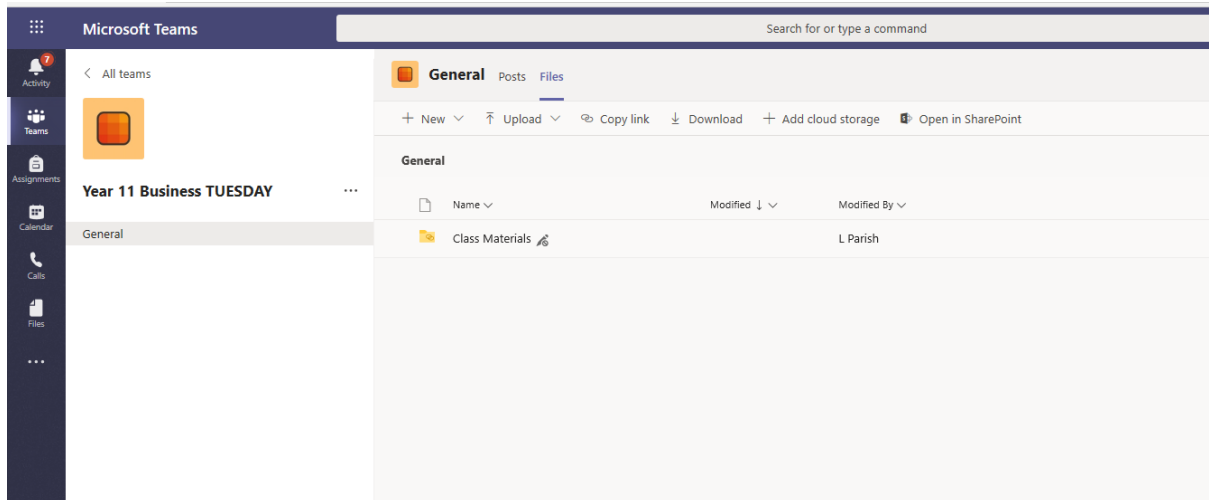


All of your subjects will be listed as a Team on this screen. Clicking on any of the options on the left hand side of the screen will change your view. Assignments that have been set by your teacher will show in assignments. You can also use the calendar to help organise yourself and this will be linked with your Microsoft Outlook Calendar.



Clicking on a Team in the Teams window will load the Chat panel for that class where you will be able to see any messages from your teacher as well as any assignments of work that have been set for that subject.

When you view an assignment you will have the option to upload work for that assignment and receive feedback from your teacher. When you have uploaded work you must be sure to click on Hand in.



Clicking on Files at the top of the Team window will let you see files that your teacher has shared with you. Exam years will also find revision material in this area.
